On that first Christmas, some 2,000 years ago, Joseph and his pregnant wife, Mary had to travel to Bethlehem from Nazareth to register in the census that had been decreed by the ruling Caesar Augustus at that time. While they were in Bethlehem, the days were completed for Mary to give birth. Unwelcome and unwanted, they could find no room in Bethlehem. The baby Jesus was born in a stable and his bed was a manger.

The Christmas story - we hear it so often. Some might have heard it called as "The Story of Baby Jesus". To others, they may have heard it as "The Nativity". Regardless of what we call it, the Christmas story is still the greatest story ever told and it never gets old.

John, one of Jesus' twelve disciples begins the fourth Gospel in the New Testament: "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:1 &14). Wishing everyone a Blessed Christmas and a joyous New Year 2016



Guard against Mission Drift

John 17: 20-23

Message delivered by Jerry Choo at the 56th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service of Penang YMCA on 26th September 2015

INTRODUCTION

My title is taken from the best selling book, Mission Drift by Peter Greer and Chris Horst. In the book the authors explain how many Christian organizations started strongly with great intensity and fervour in their mission but over time tend to cool, liberalize and eventually from its original mission and vision. Some of the Christian organizations identified were schools, universities, charities and non profits their have even lost Christian

identity. The YMCA is also identified as one of the charities that have drifted from its original mission and if nothing is done to correct its course it will eventually lose its Christian identity. So what I would like to do this evening, is to trace briefly from the YMCA history, the evolution of its mission over the years and ascertain to what extent the

movement has drifted from its Christian roots and what needs to be done to revive and reinstate its Christian heritage.

To ignore our Christian heritage is to forsake the very foundation of what made this movement a great Christian association. We also run the risk of becoming no different from the many community recreation centers and social service agencies unless we remain true to our Christian roots.

A. UNDERSTANDING THE YMCA

Early Years – Ecumenical & Evangelical Mission The YMCA was formed in London in 1844 by Sir George Williams for the purpose of winning souls to Christ. This was during the Industrial Revolution of Europe. It was a time of turmoil brought about by an uncontrolled migration of young men to the cities in search of work.

These young people faced unhealthy social and moral conditions. Footloose and cut off from their families, they were easy prey to the temptations in the brothels, taverns and gambling parlours. The YMCA emerged (Cont...) (Cont...) to provide Christian counselling, guidance and other healthy alternatives to the vices of the city.

The YMCAs earliest programs were prayer meetings, bible study classes, bible tract distribution, establishment of reading rooms and finding suitable boarding accommodations.

The impact of the London YMCA was dynamic and news of its success spread far and wide. The concept was adopted by others and YMCAs grew and spread rapidly all over the world. By 1851, there were YMCAs in Great Britain, France, Switzerland, Germany, the Netherlands, Canada, USA and Australia.

Evangelism was the thrust of its growth as it became a specialized agency to bring young men to Christ.

In 1855, leaders of the movement met in Paris and formed the World Alliance of YMCAs. At its first meeting two motions were adopted:

1. a mission statement known as the Paris Basis

"The Young Men's Christian Associations seek to unite those who regarding Jesus Christ as their God and Savior, according to the Holy Scriptures, desire to be his disciples in their faith and in their life, and to associate their efforts for the extension of his Kingdom"

- 2. John 17:21 as its moto.
- "that they all may be one that the world may believe."

The adoption of these two motions defined distinctly the ecumenical and missionary character of the movement. The YMCA concept was unique because it broke the barriers that had for centuries separated different church denominations. Thus making the YMCA a pioneer of ecumenism.

In 1881, the world council approved an international badge of the YMCA inscribed with its moto showing a bible opened to John 17:21.

This mission guided the activities of the early YMCA.

Mission Shift – From Revivalistic Christianity to Nurturing Christianity

As the movement spread in North America, there was a

mission shift. While some YMCAs were engaged in evangelical activities, others emphasized the total well being of the person. They were concerned for the improvement of the spiritual, mental, social, and physical condition of young men.

This was a shift from Revivalistic Christianity to Nurturing Christianity. The Four Fold Program was formally endorsed at the Baltimore Convention in 1879. A new symbol was also introduced. Known as the red triangle, it represented the body, mind and spirit of the individual. Soon it became the best known symbol of the YMCA throughout the world.

The Four Fold Program was widely embraced in America and Europe but emphasis was on physical development and YMCAs began to equip themselves with sports, gymnasiums, physical education and various athletic and aquatic facilities. Physical education later became the hallmark of YMCAs.

John Mott

Around this time, a young leader emerged from the student movement of the YMCA to lead the missionary work. John Mott became the college secretary of the YMCA in 1888 where he would serve for 27 years. He organized the student voluntary movement for foreign missions of the YMCA and YWCA. In 1895, he founded the World Student Christian Association. Through his inspiration and leadership more than 20,000 student volunteers joined the mission field.

Later he became the general-secretary of the International Committee of the YMCA and president of YMCA's World Committee. He organized youth exchanges, set up study groups, and arranged international youth camps. During the two World Wars he was actively involved in relief work for prisoners of war. Outspoken, he spoke out against the oppression of colonial peoples and was a pioneer in the struggle against racial discrimination.

Throughout his career, he was fully committed to the YMCA mission and showed outstanding leadership in making the YMCA a major force in missionary and ecumenical work. He worked ceaselessly to establish rapport with students and church leaders to unite the students of the world, and so hasten the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer, "that all may be one."

Outside of the YMCA he was actively involved in the ecumenical movement and was called the "father of the ecumenical movement." He chaired the Edinburgh Missionary Conference in 1910. And when the World Council of Churches was formed in 1948, he was made the honorary president at its inaugural session.

For his achievements John Mott was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

"The Peace Prize for 1946 was awarded to the head of the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), the American John Raleigh Mott, who according to the Nobel Committee had contributed to the creation of a peace-promoting religious brotherhood across national boundaries."

This was the finest hour for the YMCA. (Cont...) (Cont...) After Mott, the movement began to drift from its Christian mission of evangelism and concentrate on building character and strong bodies and social work. The YMCA need to be reminded of what Mott had said in one of his speeches - "Evangelism without social work is deficient; social work without evangelism is impotent." This is something we must not forget - evangelism and social work go hand in hand.

By 1952, the YMCA opened its doors and welcomed persons of different religions to membership.

Today the YMCAs mission has evolved "to put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind and body for all" with emphasis on social responsibility, youth development and healthy living. In practice there are few Christian programs and most YMCAs see social responsibility and youth work as the main thrust of the YMCA mission. To a large extent this Christian malaise resulted from a preference for leadership based on financial and business ability rather than spiritual and religious leadership.

This is a brief summary of how the YMCA movement has drifted from its Christian mission to become a social services agency emphasizing youth development, recreation and healthy living.

B. UNITY & EVANGELISM: John 17: 20-23

Our text today is the Lord's prayer which takes place during the last hours before his betrayal and crucifixion. His time on earth is coming to an end. But he does not want the community of believers to come to an end after his death and resurrection. So he is preparing his disciples for their mission. He knows the difficulties and hardship they will face. In verses 6-19, he prays for their protection, unity and sanctification. But after they are gone, he wants the next generation, the second, third, fourth and future generation of believers to continue with the mission.

And so he prays -

20 "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message,

Jesus is praying for future believers – he is praying for us – for you and for me. And this is what he is praying for.

21 that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

This is the key verse in our text and I want to highlight 2 main points -1. "that all of them may be one" is about Christian unity and 2. "so that the world may believe" is to tell the world about Jesus which is about evangelism. This is the key verse for advocates of Christian unity, but it must be properly understood.

The subject of unity is a sore point for Christians. There are many different interpretations. Some say it is spiritual, relational, positional and one oxymoron that it is unity in diversity. But I prefer the simple explanation by one commentator – to be seen together in harmony

I believe Jesus wants Christians to be united the way he is united to God the Father – a unity of love, of purpose and of life itself. This bond would be the authentic reality of the Christian faith. When men and women are drawn together in a unity of love and fellowship, doing good deeds together to glorify God, overcoming all obstacles that would otherwise keep them divided, would be a powerful testimony that Jesus Christ really is the Son of God sent from the Father.

United in this way, believers are a powerful witness to evangelize to the world.

In verse 22 Jesus links unity with his glory. 22 I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one—

Again there are also many interpretations of what glory means. The NT scholar, Leon Morris gives a good explanation in (The Gospel According to John [Eerdmans], p. 734): "... just as His true glory was to follow the path of lowly service culminating in the cross, so for them the true glory lay in the path of lowly service wherever it might lead them."

When Jesus was on earth, he did not choose personal ambition or fame for glory. Instead he chose suffering and servanthood that often appeared humble and weak. In Mark 10:45 he said that "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve." The path he chose was the opposite of self glory and vain glory that people seek in the world. The true glory of Jesus Christ was ultimately fully displayed by his sacrifice on the cross.

Thus humble, servanthood glory expressed by believers will contribute to the oneness and unity of God's people.

23 I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.

Here Jesus is praying for a unity of love and common identity in him. True disciples of Jesus are known by their love for one another. In John 13:34-35, Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

When believers are united in love, their unity will be a powerful attraction to a world that is starved for love.

This is Jesus' desire that the complete unity of His believers would be a testimony to the world of the great love that God has for them. (Cont...) (Cont...) What this calls for is that believers must be worthy witnesses.

The gospel message of Jesus Christ cannot be carelessly preached. It must be borne by worthy witnesses; for we are often the Bible that people read.

The truth of who Jesus is must first take root in our very being. In other words, our identity, our behaviour, how we treat others and how we live our life as a Christian must not be different from the message we bring. How can we say that God is love if we do not love? How can we say that all are one in Christ if we are divided? How can we say "Jesus is Lord," if He is not Lord in our life?

Worthiness is the love and unity of the Father and the Son in us, displaying the presence of Christ to the world.

There is a story that highlights this point. 5 Business executives were late for their flight home. So they were in a hurry as they dashed through the airport lounge. In their haste, they knocked down a girl who was carrying a basket of apples. The apples fell all over the airport lounge. They did not stop but shouted Sorry, sorry. But one of them, Andrew, felt sorry and told his friends to go on while he turned back to help the girl pick her apples. After he had picked the apples he realized the girl was blind. Feeling really bad he asked what she was doing with so many apples. She told him she sold apples for a living. She said she had 100 apples and sells each for \$1.50. When Andrew saw that most of the apples had been bruised, he knew she would not be able to sell them so he said I will buy them all. He gave her \$150.00 and told her to keep the apples. The girl was very grateful and kept thanking him. As he turned to leave, she called out, Sir, who are you? Are you Jesus? Andrew was embarrassed that he is compared to Jesus for doing a little good deed.

But the point is those who bring the gospel of Jesus are to be like Jesus - Christlike. Jesus set the example for us when he said in John 14:9, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." When Jesus was on earth, Colossians 1:15 tells us that he was the image of the invisible God. Similarly whoever brings the message of Jesus must endeavour to be like him. The messenger must be like the message. That is the extent to what being a worthy witness means.

One way of being a worthy witness can be through servant evangelism.

Servant evangelism is sharing God's love by doing acts of kindness, doing good deeds, doing social work in practical ways without asking for anything in return. The Bible tells us in Galatians 6:10 that "As we have opportunity, let us do good to all people". There is strong motivation to practice servant evangelism because Romans 2:4 tells us that God's kindness leads people to repentance.

Servant evangelism reaches people in non aggressive and non-threatening ways. Not everyone is comfortable walking into a church building, but people are more amenable to respond to acts of kindness rather than force of argument. People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. Kindness is the best form of persuasion.

Servantevangelismhas the potential towin people for Christ. But good deeds by themselves is not evangelism, it only gives Christians the opportunity to tell about God's love.

Servant evangelism is not complete until the message of Jesus is spoken. Romans 10:17 tells us, "Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." To complete the process of evangelism, to bring someone to accepting Christ as Savior, "the word about Christ" must be spoken.

Next let us look at how Christianity can be emphasized in YMCA.

C. PUTTING THE "C" BACK INTO YMCA To put Christian principles into practice it is important that a full scope of the Christian faith be offered. First we need to define what "CHRISTIAN" means for YMCA. Is it to show the love of Christ? If it is how do we go about doing it? How do we serve and care for the needs of the community? What Christian programs can we provide? These are some suggestions -

- Start a Christian Emphasis Committee made up of a group of dedicated Christians to promote the teachings of Jesus Christ in the YMCA for the purpose of carrying out our mission John 17:21
- Reach out to local churches and partner with them to provide joint Christian programs this opens the door for opportunities for the faith community to work with the YMCA.
- Build strong working relationships with churches, promoting cooperation, communication, program sharing, spiritual development, missions and outreach
- Offer the church benefits for partnering with us in ministry, including free family memberships for pastors, use of YMCA facilities for members of the church, membership discounts for facilities to church members
- Christian staff hire Christians and provide appropriate Christian leadership training
- Provide programs to meet spiritual needs –
- Provide programs and resources that promote Christian Values that can be applied in the lives of members as well as the community at large

- Conduct Bible study, Prayer groups and meetings, Singing praises, Choir, BB, GB
- Work with Salvation Army Boys Home
- Provide biblical counsel, financial resource development and committed Christian leadership, for the support of staff and volunteers
- Encourage members to discover the love and compassion that is available through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ

CONCLUSION

The YMCA was founded with the purpose of saving souls for Christ. Its mission statement known as the Paris Basis was formerly crafted in 1855 defining the YMCA as an ecumenical movement of Christians working together to extend the kingdom of Christ. Through the years its mission has been revised to adapt to changing world situations. In its early years when revivalism was sweeping Europe, its focus was on evangelism. In later years its mission was revised to developing the individual in body, mind and spirit focusing on families and health. Today it has expanded its mission to include social

services, youth development and global issues of justice, environment and poverty. In the process many YMCAs have drifted from its Christian mission. But for Penang YMCA, as we celebrate our 56th anniversary with thanksgiving to God for his faithfulness, we need to be faithful to him and guard against mission drift as guardians of the YMCA. We must not forget the achievements of past leaders like John Mott who brought international acclaim to the YMCA. Even as we revise our mission to emphasize social service and youth development we must balance social service with Christian programs. We must put the "C" back into the YMCA and not forget the words of John Mott that "Evangelism without social work is deficient; social work without evangelism is impotent."

Bangkok Trip 2015: YMCA Penang Youth team were invited to be involved in their Kids Camp at their Ban Chang Campsite from October the 5th till October the 11th 2015. Two volunteers, Asher Leo and Sherwynd Rylan Kessler, and Daniel Wong, a staff from YMCA Penang had the privilege to be part of the Kids camp.

The journey began on the 5th October 2015 where the youths from YMCA Penang depart for Bangkok in the early evening. They were picked up by the General Secretary of Bangkok YMCA, Mr. Taweechai Termkunanom accompanied by his son. On their first day of the trip, the YMCA Penang youth team were invited to experience how the YMCA



Bangkok conduct their Camps. During that time, the YMCA Bangkok was having their children day camp which was from 5th October to 16th October at two different locations,

running simultaneously, one at Bangkok Christian Guest House and the other at The Loxley Public Company of Thailand, due to the overwhelming number of participants.

The youths from YMCA Penang were briefed by one of the YMCA Bangkok Staff, Mr. Teerapat Suttinum, about the English Speaking Camp which was held at Ban Chang Campsite where the youth from YMCA Penang also helped out as staff during the camp. The age range of the campers was from 6 years old to 16 years old. On the 7th October 2015, the third



day of the trip, all the campers and the volunteers were gathered at the Bangkok Christian College where all will travel to the campsite by bus taking about three hours. During the camp, the campers took part in ice-breaking games to gel with one another. There were four teachers, teacher Mike, teacher Tom, teacher Isaiah and also teacher Georgina. They were invited to conduct English lessons for the



campers. Throughout the whole four days and three nights at the campsite, all the campers and volunteers had an enjoyable and memorable time.

During the camp, the campers and the volunteers enjoyed themselves, doing lots of fun activities such as during meals time, each Cabin (Small group) will select 1 boy to be the Angel Boy and 1 girl to be the Angel Girl. The duty of the Angel boy and Angel Girl was to prepare the meals and to place the meals on the table for their friends during every meal. Each meal session had different children to be the Angel Boy and the Angel Girl. When everyone was ready, they were not supposed to eat because they are supposed to sing a "Thank You" song. This song was supposed to be sung before every meal. It's like we pray before we eat but they replace it with this song as there were non-Christian campers/staff.

Every morning, campers, staff and volunteers gathered for morning



exercise. The exercise was conducted by one of the campers, staff and volunteers. Each one will do one exercise.

Then, all the campers, staff and volunteers would proceed to the football field to sing the national anthem (in this case it was the Thailand national anthem) and to raise the Thailand flag. After that, the Emcee of the day (OD) would recap on what we did yesterday. After that, everyone would proceed to the chapel for a story/tale time. After every tale was told, we were not supposed to clap our hands because these tales are meant for everyone to ponder on. Total tales to be told would be 3 tales.

During the English Learning Skill session, , the campers would go to 4 different stations for some creative activity. At the first station the campers

will learn about the word vibration which was illustrated by using a cup as a telephone. At the second station, the campers were required to use magazines, colour pencils, and some paper to illustrate something about themselves. For the third station, the campers were required to do a crossword puzzle and at the fourth station campers were required to draw a park by using their creativity.



There was also a talent night show, where everyone was to present a song, a dance, a skit or anything according to each group. The youth from YMCA Penang was requested to perform a song, "Rasa Sayang".

The decoration conjured a disco or



pub environment. There were also some outdoor activities, where every camper would have an experience to try out these outdoor activities like Kayaking, Flying Fox, Abseiling, Archery, Shooting, and wall-climbing. Each group only have about 20 minutes to try out for each type of activity.

Then in one of the evening, they had a camp fire at the basketball court. During the camp fire, 3 to 4 games were played where a short drama was

presented by the staff of the camp. Then each camper, staff, and volunteer was given a small stick/wood to place their bad habits on and throw them into the fire so that he or she virtually would be renew after leaving the camp. Besides, (just for this special occasion) the President of YMCA Bangkok,

Mr. Vichai Jittawait was present alongside with the General Secretary of Bangkok YMCA, Mr. Taweechai Termkunanon. They presented a certificate of participation to the Penang YMCA team for volunteering in this camp.

On the last day of the camp, the teachers did a summary/review/recap on what they

had learnt from each station during the English language sessions. Each camper was then called out to receive his/her certificate.

Before leaving the camp, the staff stood by the entrance and bid the

campers and volunteers "Goodbye" as they walked towards the bus. According to a staff, almost everyone was in tears because they wouldn't want to leave the camp due to the fun and friendships that they had.

Beginning of Autumn and Summer is coming to an end, it felt good again to set foot on familiar ground after visiting Korea 8 years ago. This year however, I am together with YMCA family of Malaysia as a whole. All those planning have finally come to fruition as we flew almost 2,800 miles to Korea participating in the most anticipated event - The Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCA's 19th General Assembly and 3rd Youth Assembly. The Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCA's 19th General Assembly and 3rd Youth Assembly was held on the 6th to 11th September 2015 in Daejeon, Korea. "Anchored on our Rock; Building a Sustainable Future" is the theme for year 2015 to encourage the development of the future direction for sustainability and to share the foundation of a common goal of the YMCA movements.

As quoted by Duncan Chowdhury, he said: "let us renew our commitment in the YMCA to continue our work for development of body, mind and spirit to fulfil our vision of a just society, based on the teachings of our Lord... Anchored on a rock indicates the firm confinement of a ship to the ground below water with an anchor. If the ship is anchored on the rock, it will withstand the storm and fierce winds." The logo symbolizes the Noah's ark in the book of Genesis Chapter 9. In the General Assembly, it has centred to identified the following specific objectives of the present context of the YMCA and to highlight the present day and emergent challenges with which the movement has to contend. The specific objectives that are laid





are:

- 1. To stimulate and renew YMCA leadership through discussions and the sharing of insights on existing realities that impact our societies and our YMCA activities;
- 2. To demonstrate and experience the togetherness in mission that exists in the YMCAs in our region and within the global family of YMCAs at large;
- 3. To search together for ways to witness the Good News in our region;
- 4. To study as one body in discovering the stark realities of our region and
- 5. To plan collectively for common actions of the YMCAs at the local, national and alliance level in responding to the challenges of our sub-regions, our region and the world as a whole.

Upon touchdown, the representative youth delegates arrived early on the 6th September 2015 at Daejeon Youth Hostel while the other YMCA

members arrive on the 7th September 2015. We were welcomed by the Korean volunteers and staff with such enthusiasm and greetings in Korean "Anyeonghaseyo" accompanied by smiles hugs. The first day is always about breaking the ice and that is what we did - games were played. We had lots of fun and connecting with other youths. Countries from Australia, Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Macau, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Sri

> Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand and not forgetting Korea.



In the keynote address, Francis Daehoon Lee: a Research Professor, Peace Studies, SungKongHoe University and an Executive member of Centre for Peace and disarmament (PSPD) spoke on making of Asia through solidarity and rethinking boundaries by reducing violence to create

safe space through addressing people's needs, transforming conflict through community meetings building relationships and by giving peace education. After each presentation and training, the youth delegates will be grouped to discuss on the issues and matters presented for the cause of each region faced. We even acted out our cause discussed. On the first night, we had the youth night which was filled with various performances and mostly dance presentation that represent our respective country until late night. Youths as we are - we dance and party till our hearts content!

After a hearty social gathering on the following day, there were 4 exposures to pick from. The youths are therefore able to choose their desired location. The four exposures are Exposure 1 - Keyword "Youth Civic Engagement" at Birlzip, Bee House, Exposure 2 - Keyword "Energy", Korea Institute of Energy Research and Green Union, Exposure 3 - Keyword " Culture" at Sango Guesthouse and lastly Exposure 4 - Keyword "Environment" at Farm Salon. The aim was to create awareness through exposures, impacting community through empowerment and to bring us closer to people. On the last night at Daejeon Youth Hostel, we parted our ways to our respective host family which was the highlight of our Youth Assembly. The youth delegates looked forward for the Home stay to get personal experience with the Korean culture and not forgetting indulging the delicacy of Korean food.

My roommate and I were greeted by our "dongseng" (little sister in Korean), So Yeong. We learnt how to cook Bibimbap a signature dish in Korea, the preparation was more complicated than I thought. It took about an hour and half-total 7 main dishes and 3 to 4 sidelines! Followed by a visit at the National Library of Korea in Sejong overlooking the open garden of modern structures, driving through the town of government sector of Sejong and girls shopping at the local stores. Woohoo! * Learning to converse the most basic Korean greetings, "Anyeonhaseyo, jeoneun Janice-eiyo" (Hi! my name is Janice) and "jal gayo" (goodbye)



On the 8th September 2015, the youth delegates joined in with the rest of the YMCA delegates for the General Assembly at Daejeon Convention Centre. The Convention throng with many Y National movements. I remember fondly the official commencement of the 19th General Assembly Opening Ceremony. In between speeches, the Youth delegates gave out a big flash mob dance to surprise and lighten the atmosphere with cheers and traditional Y-M-C-A dance move. The afternoon session were strategic dialogues followed by the presentation of the candidates standing for election. We had a glimpse of Korean Cultural performance during the welcoming dinner hosted by the Honourable Mayor Daejeon. Honoured guests delivered words of felicitations during dinner.

As we disembark from Daejeon to the Demilitarized Zone near the border of North Korea for Peace Assembly on the 9th September 2015, it was a mixture of excitement and curiosity. However, it did not occur to me the





atmosphere between South Korea and North Korea was so charged with such tension that words aren't able to describe - we could hear occasional lightning strike which we later found out that it was an actual detonation. I could not imagine the splitting of a country in a constant strain war that shares a common culture, language and even heritage. I stood by the fence that separates both country for a good picture and I pause for a moment in stillness - it was such a beautiful sight to behold, the pasture was untouched and the other side was just plain uncontaminated by

harness energy like a bicycle attached to a blender machine, upon cycling the blender did its job and satisfy us with free Banana Milkshake! We learnt the history of Chosun Dynasty in Suwon Hwaseong



Fortress that is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In the Assembly, the Strategic Dialogues are workshop based to deal with ten major issues and concerns that the YMCAs are facing today within the diverse realities of our region. These Strategies Dialogues are then focused on Renewing the mission

was enlightening for us, as we learnt about the difficulties, causes and the empowering movement to drive up the recognition of each problem faced in each region and in addition to render a changeable solution. I personally loved the alternate tourism, Christian witness in Pluralistic Society and the youth empowerment dialogue.


GATN (Global Alternative Tourism Network) Manager Training


The community in Balik Pulau has gone through development at the rate faster than we anticipated and the

In the month of July, this year, there was a very interesting Health Talk delivered by a Doctor in our Y.M.C.A. He was none other than Dr.Khoo Saye Thiam, a Consultant General Surgeon from Gleneagles Hospital Penang.

Dr. Khoo gave a very vivid explaination about Rectal Bleeding, which kept an audience of about 34 people, who attended, very attentive to his talk.

He mentioned that , 10% of adults experience rectal bleeding every year. In many of these cases the cause of the bleeding is piles. However, there are other causes, such as colon polyps and cancer, which are

more serious and if untreated could lead to fatal illness. Therefore if one has rectal bleeding, one should see a specialist urgently for proper evaluation including colonoscopy to avoid missing hidden conditions such as bowel cancer.

At the end of his talk there was a 5 to 10 minutes Q+A (Questions and Answerer session) where the Doctor answered questions from the people, present.




