# "Should I be worried about my cough

On 25th May 2016, a Health Talk was held at Penang YMCA. Professor Dr. Richard Loh, spoke on the topic, "Should I Be Worried About My Cough?"

Professor Dr. Richard Loh, a Chest Physician and Head of Department of Medicine at Penang Medical College said, cough is a normal physiological response to fight diseases. However, if a cough persists for some time and is accompanied by other symptoms like breathlessness and coughing blood, it may indicate something serious like pneumonia or T.B. When this happens, one should consult a doctor urgently. And one should go for a chest x-ray as well.

This Health Talk attracted about 70 people. At the end of the Talk, there was a Q & A session. Many questions were asked and Dr Loh gave very clear and satisfactory answers.

All in all, it was a very informative session and attendees were pleased with the Talk. Refreshments were provided.

Symptoms of angina and heart attack were also covered in his Talk. And he also informed us about treatment options available to address the risk factors associated with Coronary Artery Disease.

The Talk drew a crowd of about 60 members, and, at the end, there was a Q and A (Question and Answer) session. Many members raised questions to clear their doubts on issues connected with the Talk.

## History's Greatest Event -- The Resurrection of Jesus Christ

"Men of Israel, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. (Acts 2:22-24)

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the greatest single event in human history. This is why we celebrate this day on the Christian calendar. The word for "raised" is the compound verb anastasis. Ana means "up" and stasis means "to stand." God stood Jesus up. He was on a stone slab in a cave, a lifeless corpse. There was no more breath coming from his lungs. His heart had stopped. His brain was dead. His life was gone.

"But God" raised him from the dead. It was an absolute impossibility that Jesus could stay dead. He had done nothing to deserve death, he was sinless. This, too, Peter boldly proclaims, was the fulfillment of a prophecy from Psalm 16 by King David, "I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will live in hope, because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence." (Acts 2:25-28)

God loves us so much that He took upon himself humanity and exposed himself incarnationally to our human existence and ultimately bore upon himself our sins, our guilt, our brokenness, our alienation, capturing all that in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

What are Easter and the Resurrection? The name "Easter" did not become associated with the resurrection of Christ until the second century. It most likely came from the ancient Saxon spring festival called Ostern. Some Easter customs also originate from ancient spring festivals. The tradition of the Easter Bunny has its origins with the Saxons, who would adorn their villages with rabbits carved from wood. The giving of brightly colored eggs was a custom in the Middle East during the spring festivals.

Easter Sunday is the day of rejoicing that follows the sorrow of Good

Friday and Holy Saturday. Easter is the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead which is the very foundation of the Christian faith. Indeed, Christ is risen.

It bears witness to God's enduring promise of eternal life. As the climax of Holy Week, Easter is a time of hope and assurance. It is humanity's turning point from destruction to glory and salvation.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead confirms that He fulfilled His mission in coming to the earth. Jesus' mission was to die for the sins of the world (Matthew 1:21, John 1:29). On the cross of Calvary, Jesus Christ perfectly completed His sacrifice of atonement. "For Christ also died for sins once for all, the just for the unjust, so that He might bring us to God" (1 Peter 3:18). But before our Savior could bring us to God, not only had He to die for our sins. He had to rise from the dead.

Without the resurrection there would be no salvation for any of us. The living Christ is now able to save all who come to Him (Romans 4:25, Hebrews 7:25).

## **Understanding End Times Prophesy Revelation 20:1-15**

Message prepared and delivered by Jerry Choo on 30th June 2016 at Penang YMCA 8.00 pm worship service

#### Introduction

Our scripture for today, Revelation chapter 20 tells us that at the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, he will reign on earth for a thousand years. If this is taken literally it is simple to understand what is meant. However, because many Bible interpreters do not agree that Christ will reign on the earth for a thousand years after his second coming, a large number of interpretations have arisen over the millennial reign of Christ. In general there are four major millennial views, each with a number of variations.

What I would like to do this evening is to give you an impartial view of these four views. Much of what I will share with you is taken from the book, Understanding End Times Prophesy by Paul Benware. This book gives a very detailed explanation of the different millennial views.

All these four terms come from the word, millennium which is the Greek word for a thousand years. No where else in the bible are we told of the length of time of Christ's reign. It is only revealed to John in Revelation chapter 20 that at the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, he will reign for a thousand years here on earth. His Kingdom will be the culmination of all of human history. This glorious onethousand year reign of the Savior here on earth will be the fulfillment and the realization of the hope of all the saints of all the ages. All the OT prophets had prophesied about the coming of a conquering messiah who would rule wisely and justly. That he will defeat all Israel's enemies and that there will be peace and harmony. They thought Jesus would fulfil that prophesy. But he did not. Instead he came to fulfil the suffering servant prophesy of Isaiah. So the prophesy has not been fulfilled. Was it a pipe dream? No one knows when it will be fulfilled or will it ever be fulfilled. But when you study end times prophesy you realize that it will be fulfilled on his second coming. Let us look at one of the OT prophesies about the coming messiah.

This was prophesied in Jeremiah 23: 5 - 6, "Behold the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I shall raise up for David a righteous branch and He will reign as King and act wisely and do justice and righteousness in the land. In His days Judah will be saved and Israel will dwell securely and this is His name by which He will be called, the Lord our righteousness. Behold the days are coming."

Revelation 20 is a pivotal chapter. It also reveals that the end of the thousand-year Kingdom of our Lord will be the end of human history and will be the end of the present universe as we know it. Because after the thousand years is over, the Lord will destroy the universe completely and create a new heaven and a new earth that will become the eternal kingdom.

So Revelation 20 is a very important chapter.

A. Overview of Future Events Prophesied in the Bible Let me start by giving you an overview of future events. There are seven major events prophesied in the Bible.

## I. The Rapture

The first event is called the Rapture. This event is described by the apostle Paul in 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18

15 According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16 For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. 18 Therefore encourage one another with these words.

The term rapture is derived from the Latin word rapio meaning, "Caught up". The "Rapture" is an event that will occur when Christ descends from Heaven, and call those who know Him into Heaven. Those who had died would be the first to be resurrected. They will be followed by those who are alive who would be caught up and taken to be with the Lord up in the clouds. Both would receive new resurrected bodies when they meet the Lord.

## II. The judgment Seat of Christ

Immediately following the rapture, the resurrected saints appear before the judgment seat of Christ in heaven. 2 Corinthians 5:10 (NIV) For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

All Christians will be judged and held accountable for their conduct here on earth. It is not about whether they will be saved because Christ had died for their sins but it is about how they will be rewarded. Those who did much will be rewarded with much. Those who did little will be rewarded accordingly.

III. The Tribulation

The tribulation is a time where God's judgment is poured out on sinful humanity. The world will experience a terrible time of calamities, earthquakes, disasters and plagues where millions will perish. It is generally believed to be a period of 7 years. Based on the prophesies of Daniel 9:24-27, this period begins when the anti Christ rises to power and signs a peace treaty with the nation of Israel and allowing the Jewish temple to be rebuilt. A pawn of Satan, the anti Christ will gain worldwide control with promises of peace. He will be aided by the false prophet, who heads a religious system that requires worship of the Antichrist (Revelation 19:20).

There are two purposes for the tribulation.

The first is to save the nation of Israel including other gentiles and bring them under the new covenant which is the covenant of salvation. The tribulation is to bring Israel to the point where they will respond to God's gracious offer of salvation. They will suffer great persecution which will eventually make them realize that salvation comes only from turning to Christ.

The second purpose is to judge wicked people and nations who oppose God. Unrepentant and wicked angels will eventually be dealt with. Thus the tribulation is a time of unprecedented hardship and judgment. In a series of judgments 80% of the world's population will perish.

The tribulation is also a time when Satan will be very active. Using the Anti Christ, Satan will try to kill God's people and get the world to worship him. Christ returns to put an end to all the troubles and take control of the earth again.

IV. The second coming of Christ

At the end of the tribulation, Christ comes in power and glory from Heaven to earth. Five important events occur.

- 1. First will be the judgment of all survivors of the tribulation. Although billions have died in the tribulation, the millions who survive will be judged to determine whether they will enter the millennial kingdom. In the separation of the sheep and the goats, the sheep are allowed into the Messiah's kingdom while the goats are cast into hell. (Matthew 25:31–46).
- 2. Second is the judgment of Israel to determine whether they will enter into the Messianic kingdom.
- 3. Third is the resurrection and rewarding of old testament saints and the saints who perish in the tribulation mentioned in Rev 20:4-6; Daniel 12:2 It is at this second coming that they will be resurrected and given glorified bodies and rewarded according to the works they have done. The righteous will enter the Millennial Kingdom; the wicked will be cast into hell.
- Satan will be bound and cast into the Abyss where he will not exercise any influence for a thousand years. (Revelation 20:1–3).
- 5. The Messianic kingdom will be established on earth.
- V. The Millennial kingdom of Christ

Once all the enemies of Christ have been removed and all resurrections and judgments have taken place, the wonderful period of the millennial reign of Christ begins. All the promises made by God are fulfilled where Israel is restored and Gentiles enjoy God's blessings under Christ.

Jesus Himself will rule the world with Jerusalem as the capital.

The millennial kingdom is characterized by righteousness, peace and joy. All will worship Jesus in his glory. The curse that was placed on creation at the time of the fall will be removed. There will be no natural disasters, calamities of any sort. No sicknesses or diseases. There will be long life spans and the population will increase exponentially. It will be a time of unprecedented prosperity on earth for all and a time of peace and harmony. The animal kingdom is also transformed. No more carnivores. Animals will also become vegetarians where the lion shall lie down and play with the lamb, the sheep and the goats. It will be a time of idyllic peace and harmony that has never been experienced before.

## VI. The Final Judgment

But after the thousand years is over, Satan is let loose and in a final attempt to gain control of the earth he will deceive the nations of the world and many follow him to wage war against God's people. This is the final desperate attempt for Satan and all those who follow him, the false prophet and the wild beast. They surround God's people in Jerusalem but they are vanquished when fire comes down from out of heaven and destroys them.

Following this, three judgments will take place. First, is the final judgment of Satan and all the fallen angels. They are thrown into the eternal lake of fire where they will suffer torment in eternity.

Second, all unbelievers and all the wicked from all eras of history who had died will be resurrected to stand before the great white throne of God in a final judgment (Revelation 20:11–15). Because of their sinful actions, unbelief and wilful rejection of God's grace, their names will not be found in the book of life and they will be cast forever into the same lake of fire as Satan. Rev 20:12-13

The third judgment will involve the old earth and heaven that has been contaminated by sin, pollution and all kinds of wicked beings which necessitates their cleansing. They will also be destroyed by fire. This prepares the way for the new heaven and new earth.

## VII. The Eternal Kingdom of God

It was God's purpose from the beginning of time to rule over his creation and have fellowship with his people. But His ruler ship was challenged and his fellowship was marred by sin and rebellion. The death of Jesus paid for the sins of the world and the reconciliation of mankind with God. With the defeat of Satan and the collapse of all evil kingdoms of mankind, Jesus is established as the king of kings and the kingdom is now delivered to the Father.

God completely remakes the heavens and the earth. It is at this time that God wipes away all tears and there will be no more pain, death or sorrow. The New Jerusalem descends from heaven, and the children of God will enjoy eternity with Him (Revelation 21–22). This is a time of peace, joy and harmony for all the children of God. Rev 21:1-22:5.

This is an overview of future events prophesied in the Bible.

## B. Overview of Revelation

(Refer to chart)

Now let us look at how the chapters in the book of Revelation fit chronologically into the end times framework. The key to understanding bible prophesy is to fit the passage you are studying into the chronological framework of the 7 major end time events.

C. Four major millennial views Now let us look briefly at the four millennial views.

## Dispensational premillennialism What is dispensationalism.

"Dispensationalism is an approach to biblical interpretation which states that God uses different means of working with people (Israel and the Church) during different periods of history, usually seven chronologically successive periods." Matt Slick, President and Founder of the Christian

Apologetics and Research Ministry

"Dispensationalism is a framework for understanding the Bible. It is a system of Bible interpretation. In essence, dispensationalism is a period of stewardship whereby man is tested during God's dealings with him." (bretherenonline.org)

In other words, dispensationalism refers to the progressive revelation where God makes known his will to his creation in the way human affairs are to be managed

Dispensationalism's governing principle is that the history of humankind is divided into different periods, and God deals with the human race on the basis of some specific principle for each period. It should be noted that not all dispensationalists are agreed on the number of dispensations

## Dispensational Premillennialism

Dispensational Premillennialism holds to the view that Christ will return before the millennium and it is called dispensational because it is founded in the doctrines of dispensationalism. They believe that the church and Israel are two distinct identities with two individual redemptive plans and that God will fulfil the OT prophesies to Israel.

Dispensational Premillennialists believe that before the tribulation, a rapture will occur where Christ will resurrect believers, dead and living into heaven. This is in fulfilment of 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17. God then judges the nations of the world during a period of intense trial also known as a time of God's wrath. After this period of divine wrath, Christ will return with the saints. Satan will be bound and put in an abyss for a thousand years. Christ will reign over the earthly nations for a thousand years. After the thousand years, Satan will be released. In a last attempt in rebellion against God, he will deceive the nations, gather an army of the deceived. and take up battle against the Lord. This battle will end in the final judgment of Satan and all the wicked who follow him. They will be cast into the eternal lake of fire. The righteous will follow Christ into the eternal state of glory, where God will create the new heavens and new earth.

## Historical premillennialism

Historical premillennialism sees the second coming of Christ before the millennium and just after the tribulation. To them the rapture will occur after the tribulation at the same time as the second coming of Christ. After the millennium, Satan will be released and gather the nations to rise against the kingdom of God. They will be defeated an in a final judgment they will be cast into the eternal lake of fire. While similar in some respects to dispensational premillennialism, they differ in significant ways; notably in their way of interpreting Scripture and in the church displacing Israel.

## Amillennialism

Amillennialists do not believe in a literal thousand year reign of Christ on the earth but a spiritual one. They also see the millennium as a symbolic description of a long period of time.

They subscribe to the view that the millennium began when Christ ascended to heaven and that the Kingdom of God was inaugurated at Christ's resurrection at which point he gained victory over both Satan and the Curse. Christ is even now reigning at the right hand of God the Father over His church. After this present age has ended, Christ will return to judge the wicked before ushering the church into their eternal state. The amillennialist's hermeneutic interprets scripture (and in fact, much of apocalyptic literature) non-literally.

## Postmillennialism

Postmillennialists believe that the second coming of Christ will occur after the millennium. They see the thousand years described by John in Revelation chapter 6. Introduction to Dispensationalism by Shawn Abigail

20 as a symbolic figure – a long period of time, an era and not a literal thousand years. To them the millennial reign of Christ is also not from any literal and earthly throne, but through the manifestation of the spread of Christianity on earth. They believe the Gospel message has the power to transform lives and improve living conditions on earth. And they see the Christianization of the world as a coming golden age which will set the stage for Christ to return where all the wicked will be judged. Thereafter, all the righteous will be ushered into the eternal state of the new heavens and new earth.

These are the four major millennium views.

## Conclusion

I have attempted to explain end time events in a chronological sequence as an aid for understanding end times prophesy and also explained briefly the four major millennial views. Because of time constraint I have not been able to set out in detail the pros and cons of each view. However before coming to a dogmatic millennial perspective or dismissing any particular view, I would like to state that there are strengths and weaknesses in all the major views. This plus the fact that the book of Revelation is full of symbolism and is one of the most difficult to understand should give us caution before dismissing another's view.

Inspite of the difficulties, we can be encouraged from studying God's Prophetic Word. My advice is to go to the Bible with an open mind and seek the Holy Spirit's guidance with careful observation, interpretation and application. In the final analysis, if you are still undecided, do not fret because salvation is not built or broken on end time prophesies, but on the person of Jesus Christ. The Lord calls us to be faithful, to be holy, to be alert and to be ready for his imminent return.

## **STRATEGIC PLANNING – YMCA PENANG HOSTEL**

## THEME "FOSTERING a SERVICE CULTURE of EXCELLENCE"

As the theme implied, the 2 full days of strategic planning held from 18th to 20th June 2016 at Marina Island Hotel & Resorts, Lumut, Perak were intense, interactive and motivating.

A total of 24 participants comprising directors, youth leaders and senior staff from YMCAs Penang and Kuala Lumpur participated in the planning session. We had good fellowship, discussion, sharing of experiences and opinions. The challenging part now is bringing back what we discussed and learned for implementation.

We were thankful that Mr. Jerry Choo, Honorary Treasurer, Penang Y led and guided us as the Resource Person. The inputs and questions prepared by Mr. Choo for each topic enabled us to stay focussed throughout the group discussion.

#### The need to re-focus and re-strategize ourselves in this service line

Hostel income is the back-bone of the YMCA of Penang. It keeps the operation of the Y afloat and provides financial support to sustain community service programs and activities.

The stiff competition faced in this service industry is a fact for YMCAs in Kuala Lumpur and in Penang.

Recently, there is an influx of hotels ranging from Budget to 5-stars in and around the YMCA Kuala Lumpur and YMCA Sentral.

In Penang, just opposite the YMCA of Penang we have Bahagia and along Macalister Road we have 3 budget hotels (G Inn, Hotel 118 and Grand Inn), 2 mid-range hotels (Red Rock & Glow) and recently 1 Hotel cum Service apartment (One Pacific). In total, we have 7 places that are competing with us in providing lodging facilities at reasonable prices.

Statistics revealed that in Penang, 14 new hotels were opened for business.. In 2015, there were 11 new hotels, and, during the last 6 months in 2016, 2 new hotels were opened.. In total, we have 27 new hotels charging between RM80 to RM140 per night i.e. similar price range as YMCA Penang.

This is how competitive the hotel business has become today. Therefore, it is urgent that we look seriously into our operations so that we can remain relevant and compete successfully.

#### **Strategic Planning & Case Studies**

The strategic planning started with a case study on the Taj Mahal Palace & Tower Hotel. This Hotel as shown in the case study video was above and beyond us in every aspect. But the concept, operation and experiences shared via interview by the staff itself was a learning lesson. Participants were assigned into groups for discussion and presentation on what we learned and observed from the case study.

Before we went into analyzing our very own Y hostel via SWOT, we went through another case study that dealt with service excellence and the video

on the Ritz Carlton Hotel showed us what excellent service was all about. From here we had a discussion on creating a culture of service excellence followed by marketing and developing marketing strategies and plans.

As we moved into analyzing our Y hostel using the SWOT we also identified our market segments and key success factors besides looking into our weaknesses and threats.

It was mind blogging for some of us when we came to crafting mission, vision statement and values. As time was our constraint we could only discuss briefly.


