General Secretary's Reflection

In the last July-December 2016 issue of the Messenger, I remembered mentioning that moving into 2017 is like moving into another challenge i.e. to look forward towards the development of our Y campsite and building a sustainable Social Enterprise to keep to our Mission.

The time has come and it is going to be a long process both in planning and financial commitment. The Social Enterprise project is still very close to our heart as we continue to search for suitable and sustainable activities that could use our Y Café from afternoon until evening. We are exploring all avenues to engage youth, physically challenged youth etc. who are interested to be our partners as this is our community project and our social contribution toward the community.

We have made some headway with the Y campsite. We cleared the campsite in late March this year to get a good visual view of the land and its terrain. Equipped with photo shots of the land and tentative layout plan we were able to talk to our Architect and seek advice from the related Consultants.

- 2. to deliver inspirational environmental programs and activities that enhance the total development of mind, body and spirit using GREEN concepts and principles
- 3. to be environmentally friendly in all ways possible in the operation of the campsite and maintain it in its natural state without damaging its eco-system

The campsite will be an alternative venue for Penang Y to expand its activities due to shortage of space in its present premises. With this I would like to share some photographs and the "tentative" layout plan.



This year over 100 delegates from 22 movements in the Asia-Pacific region attended the Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCAs Executive Committee and Related Meetings of 2017. Special guests included Peter Posner, President of the World Alliance of YMCAs (WAY); Antonio Merino, general secretary of the Latin American and Caribbean Alliance of YMCAs (LACA Y); former APAY presidents Philip Kwok, Chim Hou Yan, Park Jai Chang and Yau Chung Wan; Boon Chin Tan, Senior Associate Director of YMCA USA; two representatives of Y's Men International, including its immediate past International President, Wichian Boonmapajorn from Thailand; and ecumenical guest Sunita Suna, Regional Secretary of the World Student Christian Federation-Asia-Pacific (WSCF-AP). GATN: Experience Penang

'Experience Penang' is one of the Global Alternative Tourism programmes organised by the Global YMCA in conjunction with their local partners and in this case, it was with Penang YMCA.

I spent seven days being immersed in the Penang culture. I experienced flora, fauna, food, sights and sounds of a truly wonderful place with quite wonderful hosts.

On my arrival at Penang airport I was met by two super people, Michael Cheong, Programme Executive and Rona from the programme department who took me to Penang YMCA where I would be staying for the next seven nights. On arrival I was quickly checked into my very comfortable room, got the free Wi Fi codes for the week and was then taken to a local venue where we had some wine. A very welcome rest after some eighteen hours travel.

Although this was a holiday for me I want to share one person's experience of the tourism opportunities available through YMCA that at the same time supports the work of local YMCAs. In this blog, I don't want to list everything we did on the holiday but maybe just illustrate some of the highlights.

The Food was abundant. I don't think I have been offered so much variety of food. Mainly eating from street vendors, in local cafes and restaurants.

The benefit of being hosted by young people from local YMCAs is you get a first-hand authentic experience from people who live in the communities and whose only agenda is to give you a wonderful experience of their home country. They are not in it for commercial gain.

They are not restricted by regulations that don't allow them to take you to certain places or where there is commercial gain if they take you to certain places like restaurants or bars.

It also gives the opportunity to share some of one another's culture. Michael introduced me to a wonderful little wine bar and I was able to treat him to 'Afternoon Tea' at the top of Penang Hill.

We had seven full days of visits at a very easy pace. It truly enabled me to 'Experience Penang'.

On the last evening, we joined a group of volunteers who, every week, feed homeless people on the streets of Penang. I felt privileged to be given the opportunity to participate.

Finally, it was time to depart. I have been involved in YMCA almost all my life, certainly for more than forty years. I should know by now that YMCA attracts wonderful people to work and serve at all levels. Penang was no different. We were hosted to a special dinner by the Board of Penang YMCA. The CEO gave up an enormous amount of time to ensure I had a great experience and sampled the culture and life of Penang, Janice and Rhona from the Programme department also contributed to the experience I had.

The gem in the whole experience was Michael Cheong, the Programme Executive with Penang YMCA. This is a young man who has been with YMCA in a professional capacity for just three years and personifies everything I have grown to know and love in the people I have met in YMCAs across the Globe.

He was there to pick me up at the airport, he was with me every day of my visit, he greeted me every day with the same bright welcoming smile, he introduced me Penang in a way were I felt safe and relaxed and it was very enjoyable. He gave me a number of tutorials on photography and made sure I never ran out of wine. And then bid me farewell at the airport as I was leaving. #standingontheshouldersofgiants

It is people like Michael Cheong, Mrs Ong, the CEO, Janice Chong that, together with thousands of others around the world that make YMCA probably the greatest movement that exists today.

"How do Deaf students learn?

- What teachers need to know."

On April 22nd, 2017, the Pusat Majudiri Y committee conducted a "How Do Deaf Students Learn? - What teachers need to know" workshop. Participants who were present were the deaf/hearing teachers, lecturers, parents of deaf children and friends.

Our guest speaker, Mr Lee Tur Chung came all the way from Kuala Lumpur to help conduct the workshop. He has been especially invited as a guest speaker for seminars and workshops around Malaysia to share his experience on how to teach deaf students from an early age and also to build teachers' confidence in understanding the Deaf Culture through Malaysia Sign Language (BIM). He holds a Bachelor and Master's certification in special education from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM)

We are also very grateful to Ms Anita Wong for being our sign language interpreter and assisting us in the seminar. She was happy to volunteer as she loves to help the Deaf Community in Malaysia.

We hope that through this seminar, the participants will learn more about the methods to impart knowledge to deaf students. We hope to see more participants in our future workshops in YMCA Penang!

Volunteers for Deaf Community Project

The Pusat Majudiri Y (PMY) has recently launched a community service project to teach young deaf children to better their education. PMY has successfully recruited 10 volunteers who were also joined by committee members and staff for this program. The BIM class consists of 10 lessons which were held on Tuesdays from 7th February 2017 to 11th April 2017.

They were taught to understand Malaysian Sign Language (BIM) and to learn sign language and deaf culture. The volunteers were required to give tuition to Form-1 Deaf students after completing their training. The teaching was lead by Kevin, who is a YMCA staff and a deaf person as well.

They learned about Visual Gesture Communicate (VGC), Facial Expression with Body Language and Malaysian Sign Language (BIM) as both are equally important. They really enjoyed learning the basic sign language through many practices and quizzes.

They also enjoyed the fellowship with deaf friends by communicating through sign language. We had ice-breaking games to learn basic Sign Language. It was such an enjoyable and educational event as they were able to experience sign language communication in a practical way.

The volunteers also had the opportunity to visit Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Pendidikan Khas Persekutuan (Federation School for the Deaf) and met with some of the teachers and students. They managed to discuss the planning of the tuition program for English and Maths with the school's management.

The volunteers are excited to tutor the students! It will be such an incredible experience for them. The students will have the tuition classes from 17 July 2017 onwards.




'Fellowship in Grace Harmony'







Health Talk – Depression

Dr. Ng Yin Ping, (Senior Lecturer in Psychiatry at Penang Medical College and visiting Psychiatrist at Penang Adventist Hospital) gave a very informative Health Talk on "Depression" on 24th May 2017 at YMCA Penang. She kept an audience of about 90 people glued to their seats when she expounded on the topic that evening.

According to her, most people understand depression as consisting of feelings of low mood, social withdrawal and negative thoughts including thoughts of self-harm or suicide. However, some people may posses with atypical symptoms of depression such as pain, insomnia, forgetfulness and poor concentration. Some may even continue smiling (the smiling depressive).

She also explained the diagnostic criteria for Major Depression, the importance of depression being the leading cause of disability worldwide resulting in an increased risk for suicide. Depression is common, with a prevalence rate of between 8 to 12% of the Malaysian population. Causes of depression are multifactorial and involve a complex interplay of both biological and environmental factors.

However, she emphasized that depression is not a choice or phase that can one can easily snap out of; and neither is it a form of mental weakness. It should not be considered to be a curse as reflected in some cultures. Depression is not a result of being too free with nothing to do or thinking too much. It is also not true that depression is associated only with women or equated with the state of madness. These myths can worsen the stigma already associated with depression and make it harder for people to seek help.

The good news is that depression can be treated. This includes medication, psychological therapies, lifestyle changes and addressing social issues that both contribute and aggravate the illness.

Dr. Ng also provided some tips on how people can look after themselves and also help others who may be depressed. A fact sheet on depression and suicide prevention by I-Life Suicide Prevention Campaign (https://www.facebook.com/SPC.Penang/); which contained details of NGO helplines was distributed to all the participants of the talk.

The talk concluded with a 10mins Q &A session where Dr. Ng answered questions asked by some members of the audience. Light refreshments were served after the talk.
